## Update in Diabetes and Endocrinology

The 2014 National Diabetes Statistics Report estimates that 28.9 million adults are living with diabetes in the United States. Diabetes has a significant impact on morbidity and mortality: it is the leading cause of kidney failure and a major cause of heart disease and stroke. Treatment guidelines and consensus around best practices have evolved rapidly and new therapies have become available. The course will present an up-to-date review of evidence-based recommendations and best practices for managing diabetes and related conditions. Content will cover the latest guidelines for hypertension control in the diabetic patient, medical and surgical treatment of hyperparathyroidism, and management of hyperprolactinemia. A thorough review of standards of care for transitioning the diabetic patient from hospital discharge to the outpatient setting will be presented with case discussion. An update on the treatment of obesity will include a review of current therapies and appropriate use. Teaching methods include lectures, panel discussion and question and answer with faculty.

#### **TARGET AUDIENCE:**

This course is appropriate for physicians in general practice, internal medicine; endocrinology, geriatrics, hospital medicine and general surgery. This course will also be of interest to residents and advanced practice providers.
