The Multidisciplinary Pelvic Health conference will broadly be structured into prolapse, incontinence, and non-anatomic disorders, with a focus on diagnostic investigation and both surgical and non-surgical management options. Case discussions between plenary speakers will be utilized to help anchor the clinical points and the nuances of interdisciplinary care. The course will review important national standards for testing and diagnosis including important screening that can be done by non-specialty providers, current evidence on best surgical and non-surgical care, and clinical trials and initiatives at Virginia Mason Franciscan Health. The interactive discussions amongst the faculty and the audience will also serve to illustrate the level of quaternary subspecialty care we offer at the Pelvic Floor Center.

Teaching methods include lecture, Q&A with faculty, case presentation and panel discussions.

**TARGET AUDIENCE:** This course is designed for clinicians practicing general and primary care, internal medicine, gastroenterology, geriatrics, gynecology and urology.

- Explain algorithmic approach to urinary tract infections
- Review surgical considerations for pelvic floor fistula repair
- Recommend options for patients with bladder prolapse
- Discuss how to personalize vaginal prolapse repair
- Review contemporary evaluation and treatment of rectal prolapse
- Summarize risks and benefits of mesh use in pelvic floor repair
