"13th Annual Topics in Primary Care" will focus on updates on common problems encountered in primary care practice, bringing excellent instructors to provide teaching geared toward learning and retention.

Grand Rounds features University of Washington Professor and the Director of the Cognition in Primary Care Program Dr. Barak Gaster addressing the evaluation and management of individuals with cognitive impairments in primary care. The morning session will also consist of plenaries on outpatient management of common fractures, non-alcoholic fatty liver disease, psychiatry in primary care, dermatology and rheumatoid arthritis management in primary care.

Afternoon lectures will utilize audience responses and cover topics including cancer screening guidelines, cardiovascular risk stratification, migraine treatments, non-opioid management of pain syndromes, and hyperlipidemia.

We will conclude with a talk on articles that have changed practice by Michael Soung, MD, FACP.

Teaching methods include lecture, Q&A with faculty, case presentation and case discussion with an Audience Response System.


TARGET AUDIENCE: This course is appropriate for clinicians in general and family practice and internal medicine.

OBJECTIVES:

- Evaluate cognitive concerns in the primary care setting
- Manage common fractures and know when to refer
- Review prevalence of NASH and NASH with advanced fibrosis
- Recognize uncommon side effects of SSRI/SNRIs and discontinuation symptoms
- Identify and manage common bacterial and viral skin infections
- Discuss indications, potential side effects and monitoring of new medications for rheumatoid arthritis and psoriatic arthritis
- Summarize updated guidelines on colorectal cancer screening including ages to start and when to discontinue screening
- Review evidence based interventions for migraine prevention and treatment
- Explain non-opioid evidence-based therapies for chronic back pain, acute back pain, sciatica, fibromyalgia, and neuropathy
- Outline updated guidelines for hyperlipidemia management and cardiovascular disease prevention
- Review updated evidence regarding both first-line and add-on therapy for hypertension
